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REVIEW OF LAST TRIP: NICKOLEYVA, UKRAINE

Our last ministry found us spending 3 days in Ukraine and 10 days in Jerusalem. Upon arriving in Nickoleyva, I was immediately told by the host Pastor that another Pastor was waiting to talk with me. After a quick shower, we met. I had only seen this Pastor once before, ministering for her about 2 years ago. I asked her what she thought of our ministry back then. She said it was "beyond words." She then shared that I had given her a personal word: "she was to have a ministry to Muslims." She wrestled with this word; then had an idea - establish a WEB site designed to reach Muslims. Since then, she has had about 100,000 'hits' on this site mainly from the countries of Tunis, Morocco, Algiers and Iran!

Without knowing it, I arrived for their (Orthodox) Easter Sunday. After preaching that morning, I went to a joint-Church celebration in the City Square. A stage was erected with many ministries taking part. I was asked to speak. I was proud to represent America; even more proud to share His gospel.

REVIEW OF LAST TRIP: JERUSALEM, ISRAEL

- Witnessed to two Jewish High school seniors from Chevy Chase, Maryland - a divine appointment.
- Passed the American Consulate which will serve as our temporary Embassy IN Jerusalem!
- Witnessed to a 20 yr old Orthodox Jew. I asked him where he was on his spiritual journey. Despite spending his whole days studying the Bible & Judaism, he honestly admitted that he didn't know where he was with God. I shared the love of Jesus with him.
- Visited the tomb of Oscar Schindler. Also visited *Yad Vashem*, their national Holocaust Museum.
- At a home group meeting, I prayed the sinners' prayer with a young woman. She was born and raised in Israel. Her mother was Ukrainian; her father an Arab!
- At the Sabbath celebration, led a young Ukrainian immigrant to the Lord.
- Stopped at a restaurant for a cold drink. The manager came over to me and said President Trump had visited his restaurant one year ago. I was sitting on the same chair as the President.
- April 11 - 12: *Holocaust Remembrance Day*. At 10:00 am, sirens went off and everything stopped. Drivers got out of their cars and stood in silence. Very moving.
- April 17 - 18: Israel's version of *Memorial Day* honoring soldiers who have fallen in defense of the homeland plus victims of terrorism. The Hebrew day starts at sundown and extends to the following sundown. Sirens sounded at 8:00 pm & 10:00 am. Everyone stopped.
- April 18 - 19: *Israel's 70th Anniversary Celebration*. Historically, May 14 is their date of Independence. However, the Jews follow the Hebrew calendar & celebrated on April 18th. There was singing and dancing in the streets of Jerusalem! A beautiful sight!
